The Inland Empire Four Wheelers welcome all guests to participate in club functions such as runs, business meetings, Roundups, and social gatherings. However, we would also like to welcome in our guests as full time members. As an IE4W member, you will enjoy certain benefits, just to name a few; you will be allowed to purchase plaques to display on your vehicle, you will be allowed full voting rights for bylaw changes and board of directors elections and look toward some new fun members benefits in the coming months as our membership committee builds new ideas.

The followings are the requirements set forth by the IE4W bylaws for membership requirement: Each prospective member must be 18 years or older, hold a valid driver's license, be the registered owner of a 4x4 vehicle, have the minimum CA insurance coverage, have their vehicle safety inspected, and attend 6 business meeting and drive his or her vehicle in at least 6 official runs (1 being an overnight run and 1 Adopt-A-Trail work trip) within a 12 month period. An official club run consists of 2 or more club members (with the exception of monthly club Runs). Each new member must sign the club's Assumption of Risk Waiver and will pay an annual \$69.00 fee which is used for land use and club events. Each year new land disputes surface and every off-highway recreationalist is beckoned to help support the fight. So, not only will your IE4W membership be a fun, fellowship filled experience, you will also be supporting your right to enjoy off-highway recreational areas for years to come. IE4W Club Website:

Safety by Jerry Burgess

Ready for snow.....

Some of IE4W members live in areas with snow and are familiar with hazards related to winter conditions. For the sake of those who don't live in, or are not familiar with winter driving conditions, now is the time to discuss some factors that change the way you drive in the mountains or areas with snow.

Temperatures are going to be lower, watch the actual temperatures. This means your tire pressure will be lower inside your tires. Depending upon the depth of the snow, temperature of the snow, and general air temperatures with consideration of any winds, you will have varying snow traction and composition. Snow could be powder to slush, multiple layers, or even melted and refrozen. One of your greatest obstacles will be melted snow that has turned to a sheet of ice on a shady corner of the highway. Be prepared to reduce your speed and try to anticipate this potential constantly. Give extra following distance when behind vehicles and when stopping. Watch oncoming vehicles on the highway to confirm that they are not going to be an accident potential by their method of driving, as many inexperienced drivers are on the highway with you, you just don't know who.

When driving off road in the snow, the same conditions mentioned above apply with additional concerns. Snow will cover obstacles in your path. You can sometimes 'read' the snow and look for bumps or dips that indicate a change in the surface below the snow. Off camber areas may become dangerous to sideways sliding, depending on traction. Drifts may block your trail, be prepared to move some snow. Long caravans will change freshly fallen snow to slick compacted and slippery tracks if you're at the end of the line. This may impact your ability to control your downhill or uphill traction and control of the vehicle. Vehicle recovery from stuck positions may be very difficult due to the reduction of traction on the recovery vehicle due to snow or ice under the tires. You may have to anchor the recovery vehicle to an object while winching. Expect to get in the snow for repairs or during recoveries, so be prepared with the proper winter gear, clothing and waterproof barriers. In the end, you should have a great time and have a safe successful run.

A group of about 50 descended on the IHOP in Palm Desert at 7:30. The staff did an amazing job of serving us and we were all the parking lot for our run by 8:15. After a quick driver meeting, everybody jumped on the I10 and headed East to the Cottonwood entrance of Joshua Tree National Park. At the visitor center, we were joined by another half dozen rigs. We all aired down there, had a driver's meeting, and headed through the park to Old Dale Mine Road where we hit the dirt.

Our first stop was the Mission Mine, which has one of the best preserved mills, and features two shafts that descended 1200' under the desert, making it the deepest mine west of the Mississippi. After crawling around the mill, and trying to imagine how it worked, we headed on to our next stop.

Gold Crown Mine was our second stop. It is one of the large scale operation mines. The mine operated from 1926 to 1938, and you could see all the massive concrete foundations and footings to drill and pull the ore up from 600' depths.

We drove past the town of New Dale, and Loren told stories about some of the miners that worked there, including the story of Charles Thomas who was killed in a gunfight and buried in New Dale.

We stopped for lunch at the OK Mine, another big scale operation where the claim was discovered in 1890 and was worked as recently as the3 1980s. The buildings were evident of a 100 years of the history that had taken place there.

After lunch, we drove down past the Emerald Canyon into a circle route of about 6 mines. The first one we stopped at was the Brooklyn Mine. There is an old building there that is now a Campers Cabin that some of the group hung out at, while the rest hiked up the hill to visit The Brooklyn Mine. The Brooklyn Mine tunnels went back on several levels that went deep into the mountain, and we explored them extensively with our flashlights. Super D and Toyota D explored them the deepest, crawling for a hundred yards or so.

We then went back the Rose and Peru, Princess, and Gold Standard Mines, but due to the time of day, we didn't have time to explore those, saving them for another trip. We got back to the Visitor's Center about 4:30, just ahead of the sun setting, and finished airing up in the desert darkness. After the end of the run, a group of about 30 people went to dinner in Palm Desert. It was a great day running the trails followed by dinner.
